This speaking of truth is the perfect lead-in to Refocus Film Festival, which expressly celebrates the retelling of stories and doesn't shy away from continuing to invite deeper conversation. In its third year, the festival will run October 17-20, and open with *Nightbitch*, the cinematic adaptation of the novel by Iowa City's own Rachel Yoder. Yoder's story about a new mother slowly turning into a dog is one of magical realism that remains deeply honest, cathartic, and refreshing.

From direct observation nonfiction to the stuff of fantasy, this fall is full of insightful cinema that helps us see ourselves and the world with greater clarity.






